

Arabic Language Course

In-shaa'a Allah, below is the outline for the new Arabic language course.

Part one: Introduction to Arabic Letters

This is an essential, and effective, foundation course designed to teach and help people to read and write using Arabic letters. It is for people who have never tried to learn Arabic or those who do not have confidence in their Arabic reading and writing skills. It usually takes 10 to 12 hours but will be compressed down to just six hours over three days. This is open to those who have previously completed this course, but feel that they need a refresher.

This refresher course will start, in-shaa'a Allah, on Tuesday 12 and continue on 13 and 19 June 2012. Each session will be two hours each.

Part two: Arabic Language

In order to enrol on this course you would need to have completed the foundation course above or know how to read using Arabic Letters, **with confidence!**

We will be following Madinah Books 1, 2, & 3 as the main study tools.

Inshaa'a Allah, the main course will **begin on Wednesday 20 June 2012**. Initially, It will be for one hour followed by an hour of Tafseer class. Students will be able to take advantage of learning some Quranic vocabulary and some of the meaning of the Quran.

Materials required

It is essential that all students should have:

- 1- Three different coloured pens
- 2- Two note pads (or note books) one for rough in-class writing, to be transferred into another neat writing pad or notebook.
- 3- Madinah books 1, 2 & 3 UK Islamic Academy publication (*other publications are not allowed in classroom, because we've been told that they are pirated*). We sell the set of three books for £20.00 - £5 goes towards COM fund.

Venue

The Civic Offices London Borough of Sutton (meeting room 1-5). Please check the drop down LCD screens in main reception.

Time

People are expected to be in the meeting room by 7:15 – at the very latest. ***THERE SHALL BE NO ADMITTANCE AFTER 7:30 WHEN THE TEACHING BEGINS.***

Cost

The course is free of charge but people are expected to make a voluntary contribution – according to their means. This goes towards the cost of facilities hire and running cost.

Who can attend?

All adults or children over 15. Muslim or non-Muslim all welcome.
